I will be asking these people to share more information about these ministries with you in future newsletters. This information may help you to discern ways to become involved in our vital ministry! In the meantime, I want to lift up some exciting mission opportunities in the coming weeks.

The Christian Education Committee is raising money for the U.C.C. Disaster Response. We saw the need last year with the hurricanes and wild fires. Several Sunday School classes, church groups, and families are assembling baskets for our silent auction. This fundraising effort will conclude on June 3 (Celebration Sunday). Zach Wolgemuth, Executive for U.C.C. Disaster Ministries, will be with us at 9 a.m. to share about the work we are doing in the U.S. and in other countries. I hope his presentation will spark some interest in doing some hands-on projects to help rebuild following a disaster. We can always partner with other congregations. You will recall that Marcia Eisenhour joined the members of Zion Lutheran in Landisville last year for a mission project in West Virginia. This was a transforming experience for all who participated.

Lastly, we will be feeding people in May at two community meals. Look for the sign-up sheets in the Narthex. We recall Jesus' words to the disciples---"you give them something to eat." Let us build upon our mission focused by going into the places of despair and seeing the face of Christ in those who are in need. This is what an Easter church looks like! May God fill our hearts with compassion for our neighbors in need!

STUDENT PASTOR APPROVED

Consistory approved the Elders' recommendation of Lancaster Seminary Student, Jack Hocker, to serve as Trinity's Student Pastor for the 2018-19 academic school year.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Trinity continues to experience a deficit in funds due to the acquired mortgage expenses for our building construction and increased operating expenses. An increase in weekly offerings to the "general fund" from Trinity's members is needed to cover current expenses.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS NEEDED

The Evangelism Committee needs another member, and the Christian Education/ Youth Committee is in need of two members. Please contact Pastor Rankin if you are willing to serve on these committees.

EMERGENCY/RISK MANAGEMENT TASK FORCE UPDATES

Consistory approved the Deacons' recommendation to purchase another AED for Trinity, pending approval of the Property and Finance Committees. This second AED would be mounted in Isenberg Hall. Additional fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, and first aid kits have been installed in the church. Training sessions regarding new safety procedures will be provided to members in the near future.

GLASS FOR GOOD SHEPERD WINDOW

Protective glass has been ordered and will be added to the Good Shepard Window to protect it from accidental damage. Monies to cover the cost of the protective glass were donated by a former St. Luke's member.

We gathered for worship, reports from the various committees, and remembering clergy who have died since our fall meeting. The Rev. Stewardship XXII by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

I remember stories about the difficulties folks experienced during the Great Depression. My parents were children when it began. But they shared accounts of having to scrimp and save in order to survive. Evening meals at my mother's home were sometimes sparse. In contrast, my dad grew up on a farm and food for the table was never an issue.

When dad died, a woman approached me at his funeral and said that if it had not been for his family, her family would not have survived those difficult years.

With that as a backdrop, it is no wonder that some of us have a strong need to save, to hold fast, to grasp tightly to what we have. But if we approach life from a position of scarcity, we may be hardy people, but we are hardly people of faith.

The disciples are upset when the woman washes Jesus' feet with expensive oil. They consider it wasteful. And when they are in the wilderness with Jesus and the multitude, they struggle when they are told they have to feed everyone. With Jesus, there is more than enough and the leftovers are not wasted.

Jesus is never about scarcity. He is always about abundance. For him it is never a question of "will there be enough?" Rather for him it is a question of "what are you doing with the remainder?" Jesus is about generosity and not about holding with a clenched fist.

For me, this is not a matter of whether the glass is half empty or half full. Faith is not the approach of an optimist or a pessimist. Rather faith is a grounding in the reality that in and through Christ there is sufficiency. In Christ there is always abundance. We are twice blessed when we share what we have. We are blessed in the act of giving. And we are blessed when we realize that once we have given away, we have more than a sufficient amount left.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE


Thank you to everyone who has supported our capital campaign. As of April 22 we have received 89 pledges totaling \$531,434. This means we have achieved 138% of our original goal (\$385,000). We have received \$431,252.90, 81.1% of the pledges. We have also received \$5,938.39 from people who did not submit a pledge.

There is still time to submit a pledge if you have not done so already. Pledge forms can be found in the narthex. You can put it in the offering plate or mail it to the church. We will continue to update the congregation on the status of the campaign. Remember to put your contribution in a separate envelope or use the special designation box on your envelope. Contributions in building improvement box go to the building fund!

MONTHLY FINANCIAL DATA THROUGH 3/31:

To keep the congregation informed of our budgeted financial status, we have decided to use a process used by other churches. Below is a graph comparing our monthly income/expenses through March. For the 3 months ending 3/31/18: Year to date Income: \$59,012; Year to date Expense: \$56,581.

(January income is above normal due to a member contributing for the entire year).



EXPLANATION OF ENVELOPE GIVING

With recent communications regarding our financial situation, congregants have been asking how they should mark their weekly envelopes between General and Building Funds. Following is a description of

what expenses are covered in the two (2) funds as well as an explanation of what funds are covered by your special contributions. If you are looking for an idea on how to divide your regular contribution, the General Fund represents 75% of the



GENERAL FUND

An amount of money marked in this block is used to pay for:

salaries and benefits, office & administration expenses (telephone, copier, computer, paper, postage, supplies), budgeted Benevolence items for Samaritan Center, Parish Resource, East Petersburg Fire Co., OCWM, Lancaster Association, Food Hub, property expenses such as janitorial services, snow plowing, grass maintenance, utilities

BUILDING IMPROVEMENT

budget and Building Fund 25%.

Expenses covered in this category are:

Term Loan & Mortgage – principal & interest; maintenance for heating and air conditioning, the building, property, kitchen, elevator, insurance; and funding for future capital improvements.

SPECIAL GIFT DESIGNATION

This block is used to specify a particular area of contribution such as Worship Aids, Flowers, Christian Education, Food Hub, Capital Campaign. Any and all specific contributions where you want the money to go directly to that account. It can be used for additional giving through the year to the areas identified on our Our Gifts to Others (OGTO) envelope distributed twice a year. Be sure to write on the envelope the name of the account to which you are contributing.

There are present discussions about combining the 2 present blocks...General Fund and Building Improvement into one block so there is no separation and all money goes toward the total operation of the church

Dear Trinity United Church of Christ,

Thank you for your donation to Church World Service-Lancaster. Your generous gift of \$225.00 works to ensure that refugees are offered hope and home when they first arrive to Lancaster, and are continued support and care for years after. Thank you for your support and commitment to our mission.

Over the past several months refugee arrivals to the United States have continued to be very slow. Overseas processing has slowed dramatically due to medical checks, assurances and security checks expiring, delays in security clearances; and fewer interviews being conducted by the US Department of State. Refugees are simply not being processed in numbers that would allow us to reach the 45,000-national capacity celing. Instead, the number of arrivals to the US is likely to be between 15,000-25,000 refugees for FY2018.

Words cannot express the sorrow and deep frustration that resettlement agencies across the nation are feeling right now-including us here in Lancaster. For thirty years, Lancaster has welcomed refugees, and your acceptance of the newcomer has strengthened with each passing year.

We know the opportunity and hope that we can offer as a community to refugees fleeing persecution. We know how incredible our community is and we know that as a united front, we have a burning flame to share this welcome with others-especially those who are fleeing the most horrific of stories. Thank you for your continued and inspiring commitment to the world's most vulnerable of people!

Your support through dollars works to ensure that CWS is able to continue the good fight, advocating for our neighbors and standing on the right side of things as we provide the best care for refugees living in Lancaster. Thankfully, through our 11 other support service programs, CWS will be here providing care for up to 5 years from a refugee's date of arrival. Thank you for your monetary support as we walk through these times in solidarity with our neighbors.

Change happens when we keep up the fight, even when we are tired. We cannot stop now. As quoted by the great Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., "If you can't fly, run. If you can't run, walk. If you can't walk, crawl. But whatever you do, you must keep moving forward."
