God the Gardner

When I was young, we traveled my grandmother's farm in Batavia, NY on a regular basis. This was the farm on which my father grew up and where I worked while in college. At the same time, I grew up helping

my mother in our home garden, where she wrested life from poor, clayrich soil and from whence we ate pint-sized carrots and radishes. Both of these experiences were formative for me and instilled a natural affinity for agricultural images in scripture.

Hence my love for the wonderful passage in Paul's letter to the Corinthians, in chapter three, in which he writes, "For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." (3:9 NRSV) I have also heard the passage translated as we are God's *garden* or God's *vineyard*. Either way, the agricultural image is clear and we can think of ourselves as a place wherein God's spirit grows and bears fruit. But this also means that we would be wise to consider carefully what kind of garden we are and what God is attempting to grow within us.

I learned by gardening on my own that what I want to see growing in the garden may not be what nature (or God) has in mind. Part of spiritual maturity is letting go of our rigid self-imposed garden plan and observing what grows well and naturally instead. Some gardeners (myself included) are guilty at some point of trying to force roses or peonies or sunflowers to grow in solid shade, convinced that it's just a matter of will. We do this because of the neighbor's gorgeous roses (envy) or because we think that will show what a great gardener we are (status seeking) or because we are trying to prove we are good at something (worthiness). All while ignoring the lovely, more subtle wildflowers that grow perfectly well in the shade!

In more literal terms, if your spiritual life finds healthy expression in quieter acts of contemplation or prayer, trust that this is the garden in which God dwells. If your spiritual life expresses itself in loud singing and joyful testimony, embrace that garden as your own. Stop comparing your flower to others'. Listen to your own soil and your own heart. Cultivate that which grows best in you. Lament not for what you cannot grow, but focus on how God is cultivating your heart in ways that are unique to you. God is at work in each of us, and the diversity of the flowers and fruit we bear make for the most beautiful garden of all.

Recently I had the opportunity to sit in some of the classes of Trinity Pre-school. I responded to an ad in the bulletin and/or newsletter in which the school was looking for mystery readers.

I signed up and presented the head teacher with a volunteer criminal background check [evidence for me that the school is concerned about the safety of the kids.] After checking calendars, I scheduled to read to two classes In April and then one class asked me to return in May.

While in Florida I found two books written for children about a raccoon and a porpoise [*The Adventures of Rusty and Hazel*]. In addition, I fell back on the good children's literature of Shel Silverstein.

In the realm of stewardship, I simply want to report that the experience was as good for me as I hope it was for the children. Prior to entering the classroom, I have had little interaction with this group of people who use our building. But I can report that the students were well behaved, attentive and receptive.

This is a '**shout out**' for the teachers, aides, and students. The preschool program is an important ingredient in the shaping of young lives and this is evident in the interaction of these adults and children.

And this is a '**shout out**' for the congregation for supporting this important ministry and mission to the community.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE


Thank you to everyone who has supported our capital campaign. As of May 20 we have received 89 pledges totaling \$531,434. This means we have achieved 138% of our original goal (\$385,000). We have received \$437,118.90, 82.3% of the pledges. We have also received \$6,053.39 from people who did not submit a pledge.

There is still time to submit a pledge if you have not done so already. Pledge forms can be found in the narthex. You can put it in the offering plate or mail it to the church. We will continue to update the congregation on the status of the campaign. Remember to put your contribution in a separate envelope or use the special designation box on your envelope. Contributions in building improvement box go to the building fund!

EXPLANATION OF ENVELOPE GIVING

With recent communications regarding our financial situation, congregants have been asking how they should mark their weekly envelopes between General and Building Funds. Following is a description of what expenses are covered in the two (2)

funds as well as an explanation of what funds are covered by your special contributions. If you are looking for an idea on how to divide your regular contribution, the General Fund represents 75% of the budget and Building Fund 25%.

GENERAL FUND

An amount of money marked in this block is used to pay for:

salaries and benefits, office & administration expenses (telephone, copier, computer, paper, postage, supplies), budgeted Benevolence items for Samaritan Center, Parish Resource, East Petersburg Fire Co., OCWM, Lancaster Association, Food Hub, property expenses such as janitorial services, snow plowing, grass maintenance, utilities

BUILDING IMPROVEMENT

Expenses covered in this category are:

Term Loan & Mortgage – principal & interest; maintenance for heating and air conditioning, the building, property, kitchen, elevator, insurance; and funding for future capital improvements.

SPECIAL GIFT DESIGNATION

This block is used to specify a particular area of contribution such as Worship Aids, Flowers, Christian Education, Food Hub, Capital Campaign. Any and all specific contributions where you want the money to go directly to that account. It can be used for additional giving through the year to the areas identified on our Our Gifts to Others (OGTO) envelope distributed twice a year. Be sure to write on the envelope the name of the account to which you are contributing.

There are present discussions about combining the 2 present blocks...General Fund and Building Improvement into one block so there is no separation and all money goes toward the total operation of the church


