All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR STUDENT PASTOR

Dear Fellow Disciples,

In my final homestretch toward graduation I was reflecting on some of the classes I have taken while attending seminary and realized there was a common thread or process that allowed me to fully take in all the knowledge and wisdom the subject offered me. I also noticed a connection to 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 where Paul speaks about spiritual gifts.

That common process was the art of learning together in community over time. Once in, you find that style of learning has a certain internal feel and momentum. It is ancient, and larger than you are; it weaves you together with other people in doing things none of us could do alone. Learning within the body of Christ also draws people together from across neighborhoods and communities each individual unique and different yet sharing common ground as being a member of the body of Christ. Paul makes the same claim when explaining the beauty of spiritual gifts. Paul expresses how no spiritual gift is better than another and all spiritual gifts are governed by the Holy Spirit. Each gift is unique to the individual, but all gifts are equal unto God and Christ and the common ground is we are the members of the body of Christ and we make up the whole of the body of Christ.

As the body of Christ, we also share common ground with the Eucharist. Part of shaping communities and finding common ground is table fellowship. The Eucharist can allow space to ask important questions regarding the sacrament. What does it mean when we say all are welcome to the table? Everyone is welcome at the table. There is no hierarchy at the table of Christ. The Eucharist gives the opportunity to share common-ground and learn about one another in community. Paul is teaching that exact message when he writes about spiritual gifts and how they are not subject to hierarchy. There is no ranking on which spiritual gifts are better than others. All gifts are unique yet the same in the body of Christ.

As the body of Christ let us take table fellowship and hospitality beyond the church walls and into the world where we can discover and learn about the rich spiritual gifts that we bring and learn about the spiritual gifts of others through faithful presence in community.

God is still speaking and acting, and is inviting us into the divine dance of love through learning and acceptance.

Stewardship XXX by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

February is the month that I gather together receipts and records in order to compile the information necessary to submit to the CPA for completion of the federal, state and local tax documents. When the year ends it is a time to review the list of deductions to itemize.

But this has been the focus of my year end activities in the past. I have a spread sheet with various categories across the top and the months down the left column. This exercise has enabled me to examine where our money went, whether to pay the mortgage, utilities and household expenses or contributions and medical bills.

The reality is that in the future, with the increase in the standard deduction, I probably won't have to undergo this exercise. So that raises a question for an internal dialogue. Do I give because I have been given much? Or do I give because it has a secondary benefit as a deduction against my taxable income?

Of course, for me the answer is that I give because I have been given much, because it is a part of just something I (we) do. I give because it has been incorporated into my very being. Moving forward, I wonder if my CPA will want the spread sheet that I compile each year. She will probably find it easier to simply calculate the standard deduction and tell me how much of a refund or payment is due.

But I think I will continue with the exercise, simply to have some idea what we are doing with our money and whether or not we are remaining faithful in our giving to others.



COME FOLLOW ME

The weekend includes times of worship, singing, prayer, fellowship, and good fun. But most importantly, the weekend is a concentrated time to grow in relationship to others and to deepen our relationship to Christ.

WHAT OTHERS HAVE SAID....

- ...The weekend gave me a real sense of belonging, not just as a number or face, but as a person of Christ's Body. It is hard to express the closeness, love, communion, and healing with which you leave the weekend. The weekend is certainly a rare encounter in such a superficial world. People make the weekend- we have some great people at our church. People being open and giving of themselves is what makes the weekend.
- ...The most helpful part of the COME FOLLOW ME weekend was the opportunity to really learn to know and understand members of my own church. These are people that I passed Sunday after Sunday in church saying "hello" to them but never really knowing most of their names or their real concerns of life.
- ...There is a special bond that develops, but it's funny, you don't want that bond to stop with these people. I guess it's like a chain link fence- the more you add, the stronger it becomes and the farther it can reach.
- ...Prior to the weekend, I didn't know what the body of Christ meant, intellectually or spiritually. Being with a group of people, sharing, caring...they have become trusted friends. I had not trusted the Church or the people in it. I now care deeply about the church and these people.
- ...The COME FOLLOW ME Retreat helped to teach me that the people are God's Church. We can be there for each other as well as the pastors. It helped me care for persons I didn't know so well, simply because we are part of Christ's Body. We have a common ground on which to approach each other. That realization helps to break down barriers. I think I knew this, but never saw it realized, as it was during the weekend.



THE PRESCHOOLER'S DAY

Have you ever asked your little one, "What did you do in preschool today?" and gotten a response such as "I don't know"? That's because your child has done so much in the 2-1/2 hours of school it's difficult for them to summarize and recall everything! A 3-year old has practiced choosing a toy or activity, coped with a peer who knocked into his/her block building, and managed to use scissors to cut out a shape. And that's just in the first 1/2 hour! To gain a little insight into your child's time in the classroom, try asking about specifics, then asking for more detail. Here's an example:

Adult What did you have for snack today at school?

Child Pretzels.

Adult Who were the snack helpers?

Child Kelsey and Robbie. I didn't get to help.

Adult Sounds like you would like to be a snack helper. Have you done it before?

Child Yeah, I got to hand out the napkins one time.

Adult Would you like to help me with lunch today?

Child Sure! Miss Ellie gives us 5 pretzels. I'm good at counting to 5!

Other specifics to ask about might include:

Who did you sit beside at circle time?

What was the story about today? Did you like it?

Did you use crayons/scissors/paints today?

Conversation is a huge part of learning language and social skills! Enjoy and watch your little one grow!

IS YOUR CHILD PREPARING FOR KINDERGARTEN?

If your child is 5 by September 1, 2019 he is eligible for most Kindergartens. Being developmentally ready is another standard completely. Things to consider are your child's ability to cope with transitions, care for himself independently, handle his emotions, communicate effectively, listen, focus and follow directions. Your child's confidence is important for a positive start in school!

CONFERENCES FOR 2-DAY, 3-DAY AND 4-DAY STUDENTS

Your teacher will be available for a conference to discuss your child's progress in preschool. Besides providing enriching activities in the classroom, your child's teacher is observing and assessing each student as each one engages in the activities of the day. Your conference time is a time to hear these observations and for you to express concerns or ask questions. See individual teachers for the date and times available.
