Theme: The greatest of all penitential prayers

Outline

- 1-2 I am guilty and need mercy.
- 3-5 I confess my sinfulness.

 - 7 purging, cleansing,
 - 8 relief from agony,
 - 9 the record against me blotted out,
 - 10 a new creation within me,

- 16-17 All I can offer is a broken spirit.
- 18-19 Later addition when the psalm was used by exiles who had returned home. (See Ezra 6:16.)

Notes

- Penitential
- David's sin with Bathsheba (and Uriah) is told in 2 Samuel 11, and the prophet Nathan's rebuke in 2 Samuel 12. Luther writes: "Here the doctrine of true repentance is set forth before us. There

are two elements in true repentance: recognition of sin and recognition of grace ... the fear of God and trust in mercy ... David is an outstanding example. One by one he broke almost the whole Decalogue. Yet, he would not have acknowledged these sins if Nathan had not come, but would still have wanted to be known as a righteous and holy king ... if Nathan had not come, David might have sinned against the Holy Spirit."¹

For Reflection

- On what ground does David ask for forgiveness? And what is the condition for receiving it?
- List the things (or verbs of God's work) which, when penitent, we ask God to do with us.
- The words used here for sin are transgression (*pesha*) = rebellion or defection against God, iniquity (*aven*) = depravity of conduct, perverting of right, and error (*chata*) = to miss the mark in life.
- "Create" means not restoring what was before, but to bring into being what was not there and is needed — new heart and spirit from the creative, life-giving power of God. (See Ezekiel 36:25-27.)
- Luther: "Now with us the situation is that Adam must get out and Christ come in, Adam become as nothing, and Christ alone remain and rule. For this reason there is no end of washing and cleansing in this life. For the old Adam, with which we are born, makes sinful and nullifies also the good works, in which we make a start and some progress, if God did not look upon the grace and cleansing which has begun."²
- Note how this psalm prefigures (vv. 10-13) the Christian teaching of regeneration (John 3:1-16; 2 Corinthians 5:16-21), sanctification (Romans 6:19; 12:1-2), and mission or witness (Matthew 28:19-20).

FIRST LESSON. 2 Samuel 11:1-5

In the spring of the year, the time when kings go out to battle, David sent Joab with his officers and all Israel with him; they ravaged the Ammonites, and besieged Rabbah. But David remained at Jerusalem. It happened, late one afternoon, when David rose from his couch and was walking about on the roof of the king's house, that he saw from the roof a woman bathing; the woman was very beautiful. David sent someone to inquire about the woman. It was reported, "This is Bathsheba daughter of Eliam, the wife of Uriah the Hittite." So David sent messengers to get her, and she came to him, and he lay with her. (Now she was purifying herself after her period.) Then she returned to her house. The woman conceived; and she sent and told David, "I am pregnant."

SECOND LESSON. Ephesians 3:14-21

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

GOSPEL. John 6:1-21

After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world." When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself. When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.
