CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

The Treasurer reported that Year to Date through August member gifts is running ahead of expenses however for the last three months expenses have exceeded income.

The 2022 Budget proposed by the Deacons was accepted and will presented to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting to be held on November 14th.

The recommendation of the Stewardship Committee to make two grants from the St. Luke's Endowment fund was approved. A grant of \$2,000 to Church of the Apostles UCC for use in furthering their online church worship program and a grant of \$300 to Hamilton Park UCC for support of their Climate Fair held on September 12, 2021.

A gift of \$165 to Bethany Christian Services from the Undesignated Our Gifts to Others funds was approved.

With regrets, Betty Tyndall's letter of resignation from the Elders and Consistory was accepted. All expressed appreciation for all that Betty has contributed through her leadership as an Elder on Consistory.

The date for the Congregational Annual Meeting was set for November 14th after the second services. Details on the meeting will be provided at a later date.







Over the years their focus shifted to promote volunteer services and then mainly to raise funds for annual project requests from each of the communities of UCC Homes. The Auxiliary related to each of UCC Homes sponsoring congregations through a key person, communicating and promoting activities and the needs of the organization.

After decades of tireless service and fundraising efforts that greatly enhanced life for residents of UCC Homes, the Auxiliary is disbanding. The struggle to fill positions on the Executive Committee of the Auxiliary and key person roles combined with several other roadblocks in securing long-term volunteers has spelled an end to an era.

The dissolving of the Auxiliary has been talked about extensively this year. Discussions about disbanding were held at the May and June Executive Committee meetings. The Executive Committee of the Auxiliary voted to dissolve the organization at their September 16, 2021 meeting.

"The decision to dissolve the Auxiliary was very difficult," said Mrs. Susan Myers, Auxiliary President. "The advancing age of those who were active in the Auxiliary and the time demands on younger folks made it tough to fill the leadership roles. We are excited that those who are still willing to serve will have new opportunities to support the mission of UCC Homes."

Mrs. Myers shared that those new opportunities include short-term volunteer openings for special events, specific fund-raising projects in coordination with the Development office of UCC Homes and advocacy in our local communities with a less formal structure that does not require by-laws or leadership terms.

The 60 years of selfless work of the Auxiliary will be uplifted at the 2022 Annual Corporation meeting of UCC Homes, cherishing the past and growing the future in new and different ways.





We have a number of outreach options from which we may choose. Here is a brief summary of those seeking your consideration and support.

- **Milagro House** is committed to providing education, counseling and housing for women and children experiencing homelessness here in Lancaster County.
- Bethany Children's Home started its *Helping Hands* program to provide unaccompanied children and youth the opportunity to be reunited with their families in the U.S. Youths stay an average of 10-12 days and receive basic medical care, food clothing shelter more development and basic education while their families are located.
- Hoffman Homes Inc. is a similar but longer term stay facility for troubled youth.
- Love, Inc. is a national agency that seeks to provide a conduit through which people in need can seek out much needed support efforts by local churches. This agency is geared for those among us in chronic need and seeks to transform lives in the community.
- Lancaster Theological Seminary educates men & women for here for a variety of ministry settings. Donations to LTS help to support students in need with tuition, housing, etc.
- **Phoebe Devitt** operates nursing home facilities here in central Pennsylvania. The ministries seek donations to help cover the cost of residents stay, regardless of their ability to pay.
- UCC Homes– provides benevolent care, and uncompensated care for needful seniors. This organization seeks our help to meet this need. There are homes in Ephrata, Annville, Carlisle, and Harrisburg.
