CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS –Nevin Cooley, Consistory Secretary

Consistory accepted the resignation of Ken Zimmerman as Treasurer and the appointment of Assistant Treasurer, Scott Owens, as the new Treasurer.

The May Financials were reviewed by the Treasurer and the Church and PreSchool continues to have a positive position with income exceeding expenses by \$15,527 for the first five months of 2022.

The Boards of Elders and Deacons worked on initial drafts of 2023 budgets for review by Deacons and Consistory in late summer.

The installation of the exterior light for illumination of the stained-glass window has begun.

Consistory approved a contract with Kate Austin to help Deacons and Property Committee maintain the stormwater bioretention basin on the west side of our property.

Consistory discussed some of the Covid related protocols still in effect at Trinity and made recommendations for phased discontinuation of these protocols over the next few months. Discussion has begun on restarting Koinonia and more will be shared on this when plans are finalized.

The annual Congregation Meeting date was set as Sunday, November 13th. Details on the meeting will follow in the future.

WORSHIP NEWS

We will continue to stream the 7:45 a.m. service on the Trinity Facebook page and later upload it to our website. The Eucharist will be celebrated every week at 7:45 a.m. and at the 9:30 a.m. service on July 3, 17, August 7 & 21. People are invited to come forward for communion or they can receive the elements in their pew using the pre-packaged elements.

The Consistory recently made the following changes to some of our procedures beginning July 3 (these are obviously subject to change): 1. We will no longer sign-in prior to worship. The head ushers will now be responsible for taking the attendance.

2. All the ropes except the choir loft section will be removed. Those who wish to have some physical distance are invited to sit in that section. We are hoping to remove all ropes in the fall.

A few years ago I started listing each books as I finished it. One simple reason was that I realized I was plowing through a mystery that I thought sounded

familiar and realized I had read it a few years prior. With the Covid virus, I increased my reading and the lists per year have grown. At one point I did not have any reading material on hand and went looking for something in my library, a book I had not read. Off the shelf I pulled The Art of The Possibility by Rosamund and Benjamin Zander. She is a therapist and he is a symphonic conductor.

In an early chapter on a universe of possibility they contrast scarcity with scarcity-thinking. "On the whole, resources are likely to come to you in greater abundance when you are generous and inclusive....when you are oriented to abundance, you care less about being in control, and you take more risks."

There are regions of the world where resources are locally scarce. However, scarcity thinking is a fatalistic outlook, that predicts that supplies which appear limited will run out.

Do you use the image of a glass half-full or half-empty? The former often describes an optimist, who is amazed to still have half a glass left. The latter might describe a pessimist who would say, "Woe is me, the drink is half gone."

The treasure we have been blessed with is always one of more than sufficiency. Our treasures are like cups overflowing. When we read Psalm 23, we read of a host who is extravagant and pours wine into a glass and allows it to flow over the rim.

The Psalmist is describing a God who is a generous host who embraces the concept of abundance. We would be wise to follow.

The Rev. Sandy Morris will be covering pastoral emergencies July 29-August 3. You can reach Rev. Morris at 717-385-1588.





Learning to See: A Memoir of Southern Africa by Rev. Dr. Rich Christensen



Teaching in the southern African nation of Botswana in the early 1980s, Richard Christensen faced a new world, one endlessly fascinating and challenging. Experiencing warm hospitality from many people, sharing both joyful celebrations and painful struggles with students, he and his family encountered a deeper sense of the true meaning of community. Travel in apartheid South Africa and war-weary Zimbabwe gave him a fuller understanding of the reality of oppression and how people of faith endured their plight and kept hope alive. In this experience, so surprising in many ways, he came to a deepened realization of the genuine freedom of the gospel and the hope it affords us. He saw that relationships are what save us, that the salvation of God in Christ is not merely personal and individual, but communal, and that we are thus more dependent upon one another than we realize. Learning to see the world with new eyes, he discovered not only a more expansive vision of the church and the world, but also a more honest and complete understanding of himself as a product of an affluent and segregated society. 




