Dear Friends,

If you drive by Trinity Church at night and look through the clear glass window, you will notice that the Trinity window is now illuminated. This was an idea shared with me several years ago by Pastor Emeritus Harry Royer, and I never forgot about it! Then just before his

death in 2019, Bob Price told me that he was leaving money to Trinity Church and we could use it for any purpose. I presented Pastor Royer's idea to Cherie Cataldi-Miller (Bob's daughter) and her husband, Dave. They loved the idea and contributed to this effort. Upon Dave's death this past summer, memorial funds in memory of Dave were used to support this project. We dedicated this spotlight on Thanksgiving Eve in memory of Bob & June Price and David Miller.

As we move into the Advent season, I will be focusing our attention on the readings from Isaiah. In these passages, we will discover that hope comes to us in the midst of destruction, trauma, and despair. Throughout this season, we move from darkness to light. Each Sunday we will light another candle that will help us in transition from darkness to light, from despair to hope. I can already imagine the glorious light around the sanctuary on Christmas Eve! I hope you will be with us to receive the joy of Christ as we pass the light around the sanctuary.

As we wait for the Lord to enter into our lives with light and hope, I share these words from the 20th century theologian Henri Nouwen:

In the Midst of Our Dark World

I keep expecting loud and impressive events to convince me and others of God's saving power...Our temptation is to be distracted by them...When I have no eyes for the small signs of God's presence—the smile of a baby, the carefree play of children, the words of encouragement and gestures of love offered by friends---I will always remain tempted to despair.

The small child of Bethlehem, the unknown man of Nazareth, the rejected preacher, the naked man on the cross, *he* asks for my full attention. The work of our salvation takes place in the midst of a world that continues to shout, scream, and overwhelm us with its claim and promises.

A Prayer: We welcome you, small child of Bethlehem, whose coming we await with quiet attention. Shield us from the shouts, screams, the empty promises of the season, and encourage us to turn our hopes to your coming. We know that the promise hidden in the stable in Bethlehem and rooted in the offspring of Jesse; let us look for our salvation there. Amen.

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS by Nevin Cooley

Trinity has received the \$54,817.71 gift from the estate of Ken Geib to be used for church building purposes.

The October Financials were reviewed by the Treasurer and the Church and Pre-School continues to perform within the budget and have a positive position with income exceeding expenses for the first ten months of 2022. Between July 1 and October 31 Trinity received \$11,905 in Our Gifts to Others contributions from our members. These gifts will be distributed to the various organizations by years end.

The Consistory signed a letter on behalf of the congregation to the E&R Historical Society Board of Directors in response to the recent decision to move the archives to Eden Seminary in Missouri. The letter is asking the leaders to look at other options in order to keep the archives in Pennsylvania.


Jack Richards has agreed to continue to serve on the Pastor Parish Committee and Jeremy Eberly will be serving on the Finance Committee.

The revised Cemetery Policy was approved.

Concerns were raised about the choir singing in front of the Trinity window and not the choir loft. The Board of Elders will be discussing this with the Director of Music.

Otthofer was an international studies and political science major with concentrations in international

politics and Latin American Studies.

Otthofer is Ship's seventh student/ alumna to receive a Fulbright through the US Student Program since 2013. The university also boasts 20 Fulbright Scholars, making Ship the State System leader in Fulbright grants.


Community Grab 'N Go Community Meal: Tuesday, December 27 at First Reformed U.C.C. (40 E. Orange St., Lancaster)



Learning to See: A Memoir of Southern Africa by Rev. Dr. Rich Christensen



Teaching in the southern African nation of Botswana in the early 1980s, Richard Christensen faced a new world, one endlessly fascinating and challenging. Experiencing warm hospitality from many people, sharing both joyful celebrations and painful struggles with students, he and his family encountered a deeper sense of the true meaning of community. Travel in apartheid South Africa and war-weary Zimbabwe gave him a fuller understanding of the reality of oppression and how people of faith endured their plight and kept hope alive. In this experience, so surprising in many ways, he came to a deepened realization of the genuine freedom of the gospel and the hope it affords us. He saw that relationships are what save us, that the salvation of God in Christ is not merely personal and individual, but communal, and that we are thus more dependent upon one another than we realize. Learning to see the world

with new eyes, he discovered not only a more expansive vision of the church and the world, but also a more honest and complete understanding of himself as a product of an affluent and segregated society. You can purchase book at either **Amazon.com** or **wipfandstock.com**

For several years, members have been able to make weekly/recurring donations on-line in lieu of paying cash/checks or by mail. On-line donations save the cost of a check and envelope and if using the recurring feature, remembering weekly to prepare your envelope. Presently we have several individuals/families using on-line donations either weekly or recurring.

We believe that financial transparency builds trust and is a mark of stewardship so we want to take a moment to remind you that there is a small cost for this convenience. You'll have the opportunity to help cover the cost of processing when you give. Please know that this is **100% optional**, but we appreciate your partnership in making your gift go as far as possible to impact our mission.

We have never asked our members to cover these costs especially since 2020 at the start of the pandemic. The costs are 1.05% when paying by check, 3.05% when paying by credit/debit card.

Beginning July 1, 2022, we added a feature to our on-line giving whereby you can help to cover the costs of paying online by debit/credit card or checking account. This is entirely **OPTIONAL.** There will be a check-off block to use if you wish to cover your transaction cost in addition to your contribution.

PRESCHOOL SKILLS Your child spends time each day in class developing fine motor skills like cutting with scissors, manipulating writing tools, and placing puzzle pieces. The more opportunities they have to practice at home, the less frustrating it will be for them. Keep this in mind as you make your child's "wish list" for the holiday! Does your child have access to a wide variety of writing tools, child safety scissors, glue, paints, reading/picture books and play dough? There are some wonderful teaching videos and television programs but nothing teaches better than **doing**!

A CHILD'S LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT Your child may be able to express himself so that you can understand, but he is still developing! To stimulate speech and language development:

- encourage your child to express his feelings, ideas, dreams, wishes and fears.
- comment on what you did or how you think your child feels; this will stimulate more speech than a direct question.
- allow your child to create new, free designs with crayons and paper; then ask her what she has made.
- help your child memorize songs, rhymes and verses. Nursery rhymes are terrific!
- continue to read longer stories.
- talk with your child as you would with an adult in most instances.
- remember that your child will understand more than he/she will be able to say.
- <u>actively</u> listen when your child talks.


