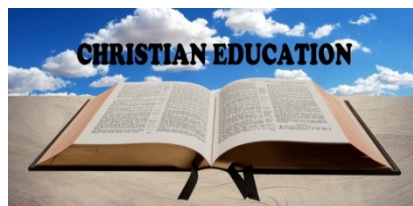



OLD GERMAN REFORMED CHURCH ANNIVERSARY SERVICE



On Sunday, September 10, 2023, at 3:00 p.m., Old Zion German Reformed Church, Brickerville, will conduct an annual anniversary service. The service provides an opportunity to reflect on Old Zion's rich history and faith traditions.

This year's theme will be "Moravians: Threat or Salvation," and will explore the sometimes contentious, sometimes compatible faith relationships between members of the German Reformed and Moravian Churches in the Eighteenth Century. The German Reformed Church is an early predecessor of

the modern United Church of Christ. The theme reflects the historical controversy between members of the Moravian and Reformed Churches, who competed for the attention of believers as they established congregations throughout Central Pennsylvania. That controversy has long since passed, as reflected in the recent merger of the Lancaster Theological Seminary and the Moravian Seminary.

Rev. William LaSalle will portray a Reformed pastor of Old Zion in the mid-1700s. **Dr. Lee Barrett**, Professor of Systematic Theology at Lancaster Theological Seminary, will explore the theme in his sermon by the same title. The worship service will include music and hymns from the period and will feature the **Ephrata Cloister Chorus under the direction of Dr. Mark Herr**. The Cloister Chorus will sing songs from the Ephrata Cloister along with music from the Reformed and Moravian traditions. **J.P. Welliver, Director of Music at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Penryn**, will play the historical pump organ at Old Zion as part of the service.

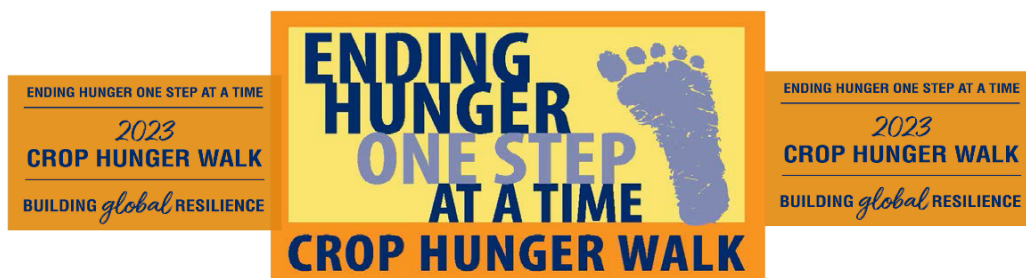
