MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

On April 7, we will celebrate the 56th anniversary of our church building. Some of our members will recall a week of dedication services that began on Monday, April 1, 1968 and concluded with the Service of Dedication on Palm Sunday, April 7, 1968. The Rev. James Moyer, the first President of

Penn Central Conference and a predecessor of Dr. Carrie Call, was the preacher. How wonderful it will be to gather in worship this year on April 7 and recall that special moment in 1968.

In this space, I want to reflect on how our church building is used to help us live out our vision. You will obviously see some overlap in the different categories.

Trinity U.C.C. is called by God to share God's love with our community:

--As I mentioned in last month's article, our building is used by the community through the Trinity Preschool, the AA group, the Scouts, the Life Line Screening, and as a polling site on Election Day.

Trinity U.C.C. is called by God to serve God's children:

-- Trinity's building welcomes children and youth through our preschool, the Scouts, Sunday School/youth group events, and Vacation Bible School.

Trinity U.C.C. is called by God to bring healing and wholeness to those in need:

- --We have a dedicated group of women who gather each month for our prayer shawl ministry. There are also people who are unable to attend the monthly gathering, but they knit or crochet shawls and pocket prayer squares at home. In the midst of knitting or crocheting, they are praying for members and friends of our congregation who are in need of God's healing love.
- --We include the order of healing several times a year as a way to seek God's healing love for ourselves or our loved ones.
- --The community gathers together to support one another in times of grief and loss. We will soon be forming a small group to help one another in the midst of the various losses we grieve in life.

<u>Trinity U.C.C.</u> is called by God to share the Gospel in liturgy, music, and study:

- --We gather weekly as the community of faith to worship God, to study the scriptures, and grow in our faith. This continues in the summer through our vibrant Vacation Bible School.
- --Musicians gather each week for rehearsals. They lead us in worship by helping us to praise to God through the gift of music.
- --We invite outside musicians to help us praise and honor God through our concert series.

As we celebrate the 56th anniversary of our church building, I look forward to your presence with us as we "catch the vision and share the joy" in following the risen Christ! I hope you will invite someone to join you for one of these ministries at Trinity Church!

TREASURE IN CLAY JARS by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

At the January Stewardship and Endowment Committee meeting, Scott Owens reported on giving for the previous year. He had done some research into the demographics and noted that 80% of the income received by the church in 2023 had come from members over the age of 65.

I carried that thought for some time, mulling over the data. I then contacted Carol, parish secretary, to find out the size of the contingent of members over 65 is. When she reported back I was surprised to learn that 48% of Trinity's membership is past the age of retirement.

But it does appear that those over 65 bear a larger burden of the budget than the rest of the congregation. These folks [and I include myself] probably live on investments, pension and social security. I also presume they have a deep and abiding commitment to the church as well as an understanding of the importance of generosity and stewardship in their personal lives.

David Thoroughman (CEO of Mortarstone) has 25 years of experience in finance, stewardship and church leadership. Mortarstone is a company that uses data and manages workflows to improve the growth and discipleship within the church. He states that the average giving of church members is \$2,000.00 per year. This compares closely with other data that says the average annual church contribution ranges between \$1,144 and \$3,422 (avg - \$2,262).

Thoroughman also claims that in each congregation, for every 100 giving units there are six who give over \$10,000.00 per year. So, I called on Dan Otthofer, financial secretary, to find out how Trinity stacks up. At Trinity the records show there are 8 members/family units giving \$10,000.00 per year or more. On top of that, there are 16 members/family units giving \$5,000.00 - \$9,999.00 each year.

Which leads me to another quote that I discovered. "Church leadership must keep in mind that their church is only one death, divorce or bad sermon away from financial disaster." Chris Gartman, a financial attorney in New York. [That may be an overstatement – but it does underscore and complement the findings of Scott Owens, mentioned above.]

Mainline Protestant congregations throughout this country have a large contingent of people with gray hair. I appreciate the faith commitment of these folks as evidenced in worship attendance, giving and service. But we need to recognize how fragile the clay jar that is the congregation of Trinity Church. Moving into the future, we need to remain faithful disciples of Jesus Christ. But we also need to ask the question, who will rise to take the place of those who lead today? Who, in the succeeding generations, will accept the treasure in clay jars that is passed on to them?

In the season of Easter I celebrate with you the joy of the resurrection.
