We will soon gather around the Advent wreath and light the candles of hope, peace, joy, and love. Each week we move from darkness to light as the wreath becomes brighter. On Christmas Eve, we will light the Christ candle as we celebrate Jesus' birth and welcome the light of Christ into the dark areas of our lives.



We must be intentional about waiting for the birth

of Jesus. The stores and the radio are already pushing Christmas upon us. As Christians, we take this time to wait and anticipate the hope, peace, joy, and love that the Christ child will bring us. Below are the words of an Advent hymn written by Rev. Carolyn Winfrey Gillette. In her notes about this hymn, Rev. Gillette writes: **United States culture is one that too often encourages us to seek immediate gratification and to look for happiness in material abundance. Our faith often involves times of waiting upon God. True joy cannot be found in possessions alone.** Augustine's favorite prayer states that "our hearts are restless until they rest in you." This hymn invites us to look for our Christmas joy in Jesus Christ, the one whose birth we prepare to celebrate.

(Sung to O Master, Let Me Walk with Thee)

God, we await your advent here: When will these desert lands rejoice? When will new blossoms bright appear And all earth praise you with one voice?

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS by Bob Kilgore

1. Rev. Carrie Call – Four Way Covenant Discussion:

Rev. Carrie shared insights from her work, including challenges with staffing, a declining OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission), and the impact of demographic shifts, such as an aging church population and a decline in church attendance. She encouraged a focus on strengths, leveraging technology, and exploring ways to reach retirees.

2. Financial Report (Denise Pfeiffer):

- **Cash Flow**: Positive as of October, though net income showed a loss of \$2,085 for the month.
- **Preschool**: A gain of \$8,000 for the month.
- AC Replacement: Will impact the budget.
- Motion Approved: Finance Committee's proposal to issue credit cards to the Preschool Director, Sexton, and Kitchen Team Chair for necessary supplies.
- Liability Insurance: A \$1 million policy for AA/Alanon was approved, with the cost covered by donations from AA/Alanon.

3. Unfinished Business:

• **Pastor/Parish Update**: Mark Eyer has accepted a new position.

A LETTER FROM OUR CONSISTORY PRESIDENT Hi Trinity Congregation,

As you know we had to replace six air conditioning units. This was not a planned project and came with a cost of \$72,000. We were able to fund \$62,000 of this large payment out of several of our funds but are left with an amount of \$9,314 that will need to come out of our operating budget.

Additionally, a few weeks ago one of our automatic side doors by the elevator broke and cost nearly \$2000 to fix this issue. We will have to replace the other two in the near future.



For several years, members have been able to make weekly/recurring donations on-line in lieu of paying cash/checks or by mail. On-line donations save the cost of a check and envelope and if using the recurring feature, remembering weekly to prepare your envelope. Presently we have several individuals/families using on-line donations either weekly or recurring.

We believe that financial transparency builds trust and is a mark of stewardship so we want to take a moment to remind you that there is a small cost for this convenience. You'll have

the opportunity to help cover the cost of processing when you give. Please know that this is **100% optional**, but we appreciate your partnership in making your gift go as far as possible to impact our mission.

We have never asked our members to cover these costs especially since 2020 at the start of the pandemic. The costs are 1.05% when paying by check, 3.05% when paying by credit/debit card.

In 2022, we added a feature to our on-line giving whereby you can help to cover the costs of paying online by debit/credit card or checking account. This is entirely **OPTIONAL.** There will be a check-off block to use if you wish to cover your transaction cost in addition to your contribution.

TREASURE IN CLAY JARS by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

As we begin Advent, I thought I would set aside any conversation or thoughts about stewardship and focus instead upon the season. I went looking for a definition of Advent and headed for a familiar author who has crafted his work in metaphor and image. In his book *Whistling In The Dark*, Frederick Buechner has this to say about Advent.

"In the silence of a midwinter dusk there is far off in the deeps of it somewhere a sound

so faint that for all you can tell it may be only the sound of the silence itself. You hold

your breath to listen.

"You walk up the steps to the front door. The empty windows at either side of it tell you

nothing, or almost nothing. For a second you catch of whiff in the air of some fragrance

that reminds you of a place you've never been and a time you have no words for. You

are aware of the beating of your heart.

"The extraordinary thing that is about to happen is matched only by the extraordinary

moment just before it happens. Advent is the name of that moment.

"....if you concentrate just for an instant, far off in the deeps of you somewhere you can

feel the beating of your heart. For all its madness and lostness, not to mention your

own, you can hear the world itself holding its breath.

In a poetic, metaphorical way Buechner provides a different image of Advent, a new way to look at and consider the season we are celebrating as we wait with expectation. O Come, O Come Emmanuel.




The Kid: Silent Film with Don Kinnier, Organist Wednesday, March 12, 2025, 7:00 pm

Keystone Working Group Communications Summary of The Special Meeting on November 15, 2024

"The Lord has done great things for us, and we rejoiced!" – Psalm 126:3 Thanks be to God!

A wide range of emotions filled our commonwealth and beyond on November 9 as the four area conferences met remotely and shared collectively in our vote to become one in Christ as the Keystone Conference. We are modeling grief... and Resurrection Life... Together, We Are Stronger!

Overwhelmingly the vote of this historic meeting was affirmed. Penn West Conference: 134 Yes; 17 No = 89% Penn Central Conference: 286 Yes; 28 No = 91% Pennsylvania Southeast Conference: 246 Yes; 19 No = 92% Penn Northeast Conference: 141 Yes; 2 No = 98.6%

Our motion to merge moves forward to the UCC General Synod in July 2025 to combine our boundaries into one Keystone Conference UCC. The wide and diverse support indicates your sacred trust in both the people and the process of this collective two-year study, work and presentation for our discernment. For that, we express our profound gratitude.

Now... the real work of bringing this vision into reality begins in greater detail. The next steps of legal, financial, personnel, technology and more will start taking shape. The 3 regional areas for staffing support will be one of the first priorities. New transitional board leadership will be elected and transitional ministerial and staff leadership will be hired. Townhall events and more information will be provided in the coming months for adoption of a new Constitution and Bylaws in Spring conference meetings. Please review the updated timeline on the <u>website</u>. The Keystone Conference will meet officially for the first time in Spring 2026.

You will soon receive a Pastoral Letter from our four Conference Ministers. Our current congregations and associations will all have next steps to take as well. Together, we will further develop plans, and share our collective expertise and resources, creating more meaningful relationships in ministry. This is holy work!

It is our responsibility to share this summary in our various ministry settings with ALL! Relying on the grace of God, we now take the next steps of bringing this great vision into reality, by taking the hands of Christ, breathing deeply the presence of the Spirit, and walking resolutely in God's grace. 


