Dear Friends.

On October 15, 1725, German settlers gathered at Falkner Swamp Reformed Church in Gilbertsville, PA for the first communion service. John Philip Boehm, a school teacher and church lay leader who immigrated to Pennsylvania in 1720, became the first pastor of Falkner Swamp and was considered the founder of the German Reformed Church.

As the German immigrants settled throughout this region, Boehm was serving multiple congregations as a lay itinerant pastor. They relied heavily on lay leaders. In 1729, Boehm was ordained and continued to serve many congregations since there weren't many ordained ministers to offer the sacraments. Rev. Boehm died in 1749 at the age of sixty-five. He had just finished celebrating communion at a church and died on his way home.

Almost a hundred years later, a small group of men gathered in East Petersburg on October 26, 1848 to be installed as deacons and elders. There were also nineteen men and twenty-eight women who gathered for the first communion service. This led to the birth of Trinity Reformed Church.

We will gather on October 26 to celebrate the 177th anniversary of Trinity Church. We will recognize members who have been a part of Trinity & St. Luke's for fifty years or more. As we gather for Holy Communion, I encourage us to think about those German settlers who gathered for the first communion service in 1725. I also encourage us to think about those men and women who gathered in 1848 for the first communion service at Trinity Church. We are connected to our ancestors in the faith!

As we celebrate these significant anniversaries, I share this prayer of thanksgiving from the Reformed Church Book of Worship:

O God, Giver of all good and Fountain of all mercies, in whom are the springs of our life: all glory, thanks and praise be unto Thee for thine ever-flowing goodness; for thy faithfulness which is from one generation to another; for thy mercies which are new every morning, fresh every moment, and more than we can number: for seed-time and harvest, and summer and winter, and nights and days throughout the year; for food and raiment and shelter; for health and reason; for childhood and age, and youth and manhood; for thy fatherly hand ever upon us in sickness and in health, in joy and in sorrow, in life and in death; for friends and kindred and kind benefactors; for home and country; for thy Church and for thy gospel; yea, Lord, for that there is nothing in which we may not bless and thank Thee. And therefore do we take the cup of salvation, and call upon thy name, pay our vows now in the presence of all thy people; humbly beseeching Thee to accept this our becoming service and bounden duty, even as we offer it, in the name and through the infinite merits of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS by Bob Kilgore

At its September 16, 2025 meeting, the Consistory reviewed the treasurer's report noting strong liquidity despite modest year-to-date losses, and unanimously passed the 2026 budget.

Pastor Chris highlighted the successful planning start with the new organist, Carol's upcoming retirement with a transition plan for the secretary position, positive progress with the new preschool director, and ongoing community partnerships.

Planning is underway for Advent and Christmas, with a leadership seminar scheduled for October 11 and guest preacher Rev. Milton Gockley on October 26.

The consistory also ratified an email vote to provide system access for the treasurer, heard updates on the nominating committee and preparations for the November 9 congregational meeting.

CHURCH GIVING CARDS: Since some members give online or on a monthly basis, they don't have anything to place in the offering plate during worship. The Consistory recently implemented something that Pastor Rankin saw at another church. TREASURE IN CLAY JARS by Rev. Jack Esbenshade

It is not my place to criticize others or to look down on the work of other people. But the other Sunday as I sat with Donna at her church, the pastor commented that members should give to the church to pay the bills and keep the lights on. I cringed.

I have taken considerable time and effort to place giving to the church or any charitable organization as an act of faith. For me this business of giving and stewardship are based on knowing that even when the cruet of oil is just about empty, there is enough to make a little cake and feed the prophet.

Many years ago, when I started in ministry we received a Christmas card with the three wise men on the cover. The person who sent it told me to place it over the lintel of the front door. He went on to say that we would not want for anything in the coming year.

Now I don't know if I accept all the folklore that goes with such actions. But I can state that we did not want in the that year. And we continued the practice for many years.

Scott Owens, at a recent meeting of the Stewardship/Endowment Committee quoted Millard Fuller (founder of Habitat for Humanity) was publicly speaking and at the time of the offering said something to the effect - 'open your wallet and there's a \$20.00 and \$5.00 in there – put the \$20.00 in the plate – you still have \$5.00.'

What I do know is that generosity and stewardship are learned and require practice.

Keep up the good work and keep exercising your spiritual life.


UPCOMING LEADERSHP SEMINAR

Online Giving Information

For several years, members have been able to make recurring donations online in lieu of paying cash/checks or by mail. Online donations save the cost of a check and envelope and if using the recurring feature, remembering weekly to prepare your envelope. Presently we have a few giving units who give to the church online either weekly or recurring.

We want to remind you that there is a small fee when giving online. You'll have the opportunity to help cover the cost of processing when you give. Please know that this is 100% optional, but we appreciate your partnership in making your gift go as far as possible to impact our mission. Your contribution towards the processing fee will be recorded on your giving statement and will also help the church's budget.

In 2022, we added a feature on our website to give you the opportunity to cover the added cost of giving online. The costs are 1.05% when paying by check through your bank or 3.05% when paying by credit/debit card. There will be a check-off block to use if you wish to cover your transaction cost in addition to your contribution.

Mission Moment from Lebanon

During the war in Lebanon, fear gripped entire communities. People fled from their homes and villages as they came under bombardment. Fields burned. Families ran to protect their lives and the lives of their children, clinging to dignity and trying to shield their young ones from the horrors of war.

The Forum for Development, Culture, and Dialogue (FDCD) has witnessed firsthand how thousands upon thousands of people are suddenly displaced, in desperate need of shelter, support, and the most basic necessities for survival. FDCD staff went to the temporary shelters in schools and camps where displaced people had gathered. We brought food so they would not go

hungry, but we also brought something equally important: the assurance that God had not abandoned them.

Humanitarian response to the war.



It was during this time that we met a young displaced boy. He was eating a banana, but only half of it. When asked why, he said, "I will only eat half. The other half is for my brother." This simple act of love moved us deeply. It reminded us to search for the children, women, and elderly—especially those who were forgotten, living in places where no one else was offering assistance. Our mission was, and still is, to lift people up, just as Jesus lifted people up: to walk in their shoes, stand with them in their struggles, and support them as fellow human beings. FDCD's mission, especially in

partnership with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and United Church of Christ through Global Ministries, has always been to serve all humankind. We want them to know they are children of God, never abandoned, always welcomed. Like Jesus, his ministry was not confined to closed doors; it was open to all, extending freedom, healing, and blessing to everyone without distinction.

Prayers for Lebanon

Strong and loving God, You who share in the sufferings of your people,

Teach us to remove from our hearts all anger, bitterness, and misunderstanding. Draw us nearer to You so that we may live always in fellowship with one another.

2025 Our Gifts to Others from the Board of Deacons

Each year Trinity U.C.C. considers donations titled "*Our Gifts to Others*" (OGTO). These annual gifts serve to support various missions of the U.C.C. and the wider community!

Here is a brief summary of the missions you can support: Milagro House is committed to providing education, counseling and housing fowomen and children experiencing homelessness here in Lancaster County.
Bethany Children's Home started its <i>Helping Hands</i> program to provide unaccompanied children and youth the opportunity to be reunited with their families in the U.S. Youth will stay an average of 10-12 days and receive basic medical care, food, clothing, shelter, and basic education while their families are located.
Hoffman Homes Inc. is a nonprofit that provides comprehensive psychiatric care, treatment, support, and education to youth and young adults and their families from across Pennsylvania. We inspire hope and brighter futures.
Love, Inc. is a national agency that seeks to provide a conduit through which people in need can seek out much needed support efforts by local churches. This agency is geared for those among us in chronic need and seeks to transform lives in the community.
Lancaster Theological Seminary – educates men & women for here for a variety of ministry settings. Donations to LTS help to support students in need with tuition, housing, etc.
Phoebe Devitt – operates nursing home facilities here in central Pennsylvania. A ministry of the U.C.C., they seek donations to help cover the cost of residents stay, regardless of their ability to pay.
U.C.C. Homes— provides benevolent care, and uncompensated care for needful seniors. This organization seeks our help to meet this need. There are homes in Ephrata, Annville, Carlisle, and Harrisburg.


